Dear Parents and Guardians,

In accordance with Indiana's approved Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) Flexibility Waiver, each school and school district must demonstrate adequate annual progress within three areas: Annual State Assessment Proficiency (ISTEP+ and ECA) Goals, Annual College and Career Readiness (CCR) Rate Goals, and Annual Graduation Rate Goals.
